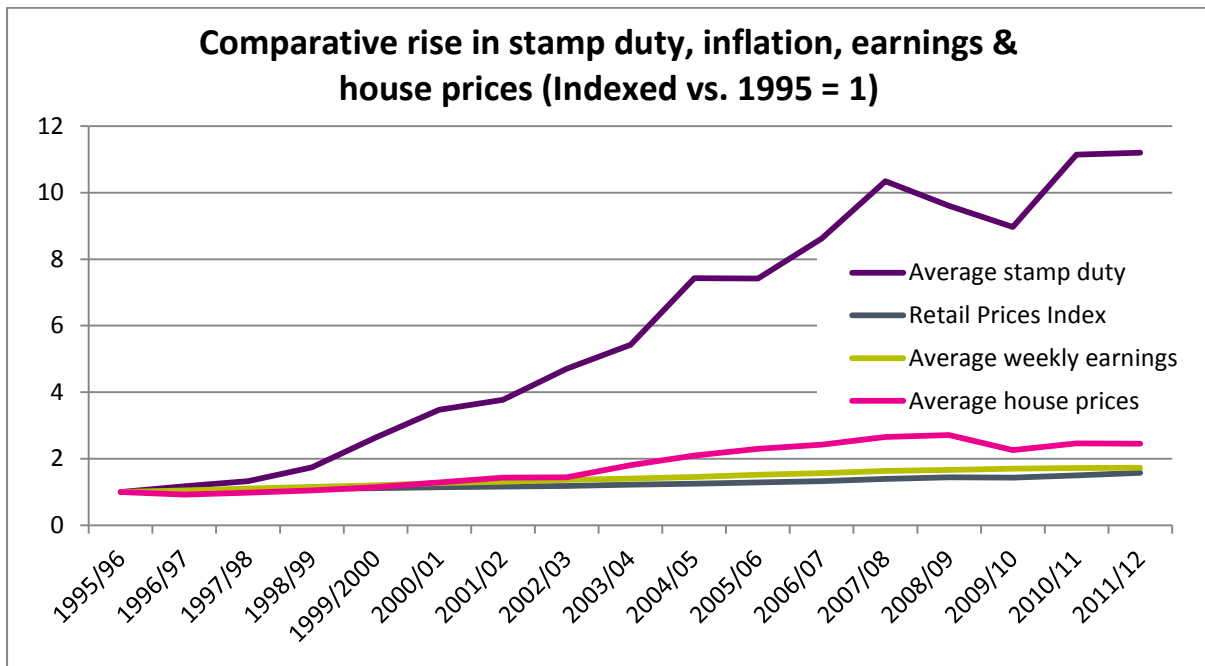




Stamp duty rises have far outstripped house prices, inflation, and earnings



Over the last decade and a half, stamp duty has increased by 7.1 times the rate of inflation, 6.5 times average earnings, and 4.6 times average house prices. It is often said that house prices have been rising at an unsustainably fast rate, but they are virtually static when compared to rocketing stamp duty
